Easter

Today we will celebrate Holy Communion. Those who bless and receive the sacrament at home, please prepare food for yourself, in celebration of the Risen Christ and remembering that our oldest telling of this story is in a letter of Paul to the Corinthian church. Those letters were our faith's early "distance learning." The unusual-to-us services of this past year are firmly a part of our tradition. You may prepare a slice or roll of bread, a corn tortilla, Naan, or rice cake, and a cup of juice — perhaps grape or cranberry — or wine, with or without alcohol.¹
