TEACHERS NEEDED FOR SUNDAY SCHOOL

As soon as we are safely able, Sunday school will resume for children and youth in 5K - 9th grade. For most families it'll have been two years since they've been able to return to church. While parents are

getting spiritual nourishment during the service, children will be learning and of course, having fun in the classroom. If you're interested in teaching for 45 minutes on a Sunday (not every Sunday), email our director of faith development, Rebecca Malke.

Common Concerns About Teaching:

I'm going to miss out on church services!

Sunday school begins right before the reflection so you're still able to gather with people before, during and after the church service. With our services now being recorded you can go to the church YouTube channel to hear the reflection and see the rest of the service. And again, you're not needed every Sunday.

I don't know enough to teach!

You're given a step by step guide on what and how to teach. Most people say that they've learned more about the Bible and their faith now that they've taught Sunday school then they ever have before!

There's too much preparation and I'll be doing it alone!

Memorial's safe sanctuary policy requires two adults to be in a classroom at all times so you'll always have a co-teacher. Work can be divided up between the two of you as in one reads the story or shows the video while the other one prepares the activity. Preparation for the class doesn't require a lot of time. You're expected to go over the lesson beforehand and familiarize yourself but that usually doesn't take more an hour each week.
